We create wedding bands from unique materials such as antler, whiskey barrels, and coffee.

OPEN

To fit an adult female

YOU WILL NEED

Cascade Eco+, 100% wool (437m per 250g)

1 x 250g ball in Berry 0508

1 pair each of 4.5mm and 5.5mm needles

Yarn needle

Cardboard

Sharp scissors

TENSION

17 sts and 25 rows to 10cm (4in) over blackberry pattern using 5.5mm needles

Use larger or smaller needles if necessary to obtain correct tension.

Note: Yarn amounts given are based on average requirements and are approximate.

BEANIE

Rep row 1 another 32 times, ending with a RS row.

With 4.5mm needles, cast on 102 sts.

Row 34: K2, p1, m1, [(k1, p1)twice, k1, m1, (p1, k1) twice, p1, m1)9 times, (k1, p1) twice, k1, m1, (p1, k1) twice (122 sts).

Row 1 (RS): K1, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Change to 5.5mm needles.

Row 35 (RS): Purl. Row 36: K1, *inc2 in next stitch, p3tog; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 37: Purl.

Rows 35 to 38 set the blackberry pattern.

Row 72: K1, *p3tog, k1; rep from * to last st, k1 (62 sts).

Row 38: K1, *p3tog, inc2 in next st; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 71: Purl.

Rep these four rows another eight times.

Row 73: Purl.

Row 74: K1, (p3tog) 20 times, k1 (22 sts).

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail, and thread tail through rem 11 sts.

Cut a 4.5cm (1.75in) hole in the centre of each to create two rings.

Cut two cardboard circles, 12cm (4.75in) in diameter.

carefully snip through all the loops of the wound yarn. Thread a long length of yarn between the two card rings and around the centre of the pompom, then tie

Pull up the tail of yarn at the top, to close up the stitches. Fasten off securely.

Hold the two rings together and wind yarn evenly through the centre hole and around the edge until the centre hole is full with the wraps. Using scissors, slip the blade between the two pieces of cardboard and

Using the tail, sew the seam on the main part of the hat and the top half of the ribbing using backstitch. Turn right side out and stitch the lower part of the ribbing with wrong sides together, so that the seam

will be on the inside when the ribbed band is turned back. Stitch the pompom firmly to the crown. Abbreviations

Fold the hat in half, inside out, and match the two edges.
